- Use the Proper Resources: There are many different informative medical journals, health directories, and portals on the internet. Make sure that your education materials stem from truthful information and not "fake" sources.
- Rely on Professional Advice: Steer away from inaccurate social media posts or articles. Instead, guide your research with information from health professionals who have dedicated years of education to the medical field.

Make sure your online sources provide credible information based on professional facts.
