What is a Handwriting Assessment?

Handwriting assessments provide goals for your child's therapist to use during the intervention. The therapist observes your child's medical history, environmental factors, educational demands, and current handwriting capabilities.

What considerations are made when assessing your child's handwriting?

- Organisation of a Writing Sample: How does your child use lines, letters, sizing, and spacing?
- **Pencil/Pen Grip:** How does your child handle the device based on pressure, tension, positioning, and fluency of movement?
- **Handwriting Speed:** Is your child performing within the normal limits compared to their peers based on accuracy and speed?
- **Classroom Observations**: What does your child's workspace look like? Is their behaviour appropriate? How does their school work look on paper?
- Quality of the Material: How does your child write from memory during dictation or composition?

Your child may require a handwriting assessment and intervention if they have pre-existing medical conditions, limb injuries, learning or language deficits, visual issues, or fine motor delays.

How Can an Occupational Therapist Improve Your Child's Handwriting?

By making skilled observations during your child's assessment, the occupational therapist provides strategies that address your child's capacity to learn and communicate in the classroom.

Here are some handwriting skills your occupational therapist can employ:

- **Prompts:** These are both visual and verbal prompts addressing your child's pen or pencil grip. They also focus on line spacing and letter formation.
- **Slope Boards and Grips:** These can be used to improve the pen or pencil grip. This skill will also improve your child's body posture.
- Paper Templates and Guides: These can be used to provide ongoing writing practice and can even be used at home.

- Fine Motor Skills Activities: These can help to improve your child's dexterity and hand function.
- Technology: Apps on devices such as tablets or phones can make writing practice exciting and fun!
- Practising with Modified Devices: Modified devices such as special pens and/or pencils can improve
 your child's grip and hand control. These devices are also great for dexterity as their hands continue
 to grow.

How Can Improved Handwriting Help Your School-Aged Child?
