The coastal city of tea and gardens trades old-fashioned ambience for a fashionable flair.

Why Now: Long recognized for its charm and beauty, graceful Victoria is in the midst of a renaissance. A recent influx of techpreneurs and creative millennials has reinvigorated the seaside dowager's garden-party image. Today, visitors and locals alike flock to swank cocktail lounges, stylish shops and hip eateries. Where to Go: Inner Harbour's grand dame—the Fairmont Empress hotel—put the final touches on a glittering \$60 million refresh last year. Inside, vibrant pop-art portraits of the city's namesake queen preside over the sumptuous Q Bar. Don't miss the Q 1908 cocktail, a royal purple concoction made with Empress 1908 color-changing gin.

In Victoria, breakfast is an art form. Line up early at The Jam Cafe for pulled-pork pancakes or one of seven different kinds of eggs benedict. Fully fueled, wander the warren of streets around Lower Johnson Street and Chinatown. Midcentury-modern furniture, housewares and home décor abound at Trig Vintage, while old gambling dens house funky shops on tiny Fan Tan Alley. Nearby, Madrona Gallery features the works of established and emerging Canadian artists. Pay homage to Victoria's favorite tradition-teatime-at Abkhazi Garden, a verdant refuge on the edge of Oak Bay Village. Or skip straight to drinks at Little Jumbo Restaurant & Bar with the Gin and Tea, which features two blends of local Silk Road teas. Tuck into dinner at the just-launched The Courtney Room, where chef Sam Harris gives local ingredients a French twist. - GINA DECAPRIO VERCESI
