Indian Reservations have requested a five-day emergency supply of hay after blizzard conditions, deep snow and frigid temperatures paralyzed the region.

Over 10,000 animals on Blackfeet, Fort Belknap and Northern Cheyenne Reservations are at risk of starvation. In fact, many horses and cattle across the state could run out of hay without your help.

It's so bad that the Governor declared a State of Emergency for the state of Montana. We're trying to help every animal we can but dozens have already starved or perished in the frigid cold.

Every animal we can save matters so much! We got the first trucks of hay on the way after the storms began, and we need to continue this critical work through the next five days to save as many animals as possible.
