

The Cultural Affect of Science on the English Language and the Consequence on Relationships.

Language is structured to implement the values and goals of the culture. In our culture, the English language is designed to satisfy the requirements of a technological and scientifically advanced society. Naturally, the language that we speak is designed to allow the greatest ease in this process. The basics of English have been strongly influenced by the Scientific Method; that of Problem Solving as experienced through directed questions, which are designed to generate information and data. This data is gathered, stored, processed, and used in developing answers to problems and then applied through the advancement of technology. English, as a technological language is extremely effective in this process.

I might suggest that English is perhaps the most powerful form of a technological language as evidenced by the tremendous scientific strides the United States has made. However, from my experience it is seriously deficient as to be almost totally ineffective when used for communication of a personal nature, as evidenced by the increased rate of divorce and mental illness. English being a technological language, by nature and design detaches feelings. The inability of a language to communicate feelings is a formula for frustration and the gradual but steady deterioration of relationships.

How does English, as a technological language undermine relationships? The answer is in the very foundation assumptions of science.

Science is based upon the following general precepts:

1. Things are not good enough the way they are. Things can be better.
2. The way things are, specifically the natural order, is threatening to mankind.
3. Nature, to be understood, can be subjected to the scientific process by being broken down into its components parts, polarized and quantified through measurement, and the results analyzed and recorded.
4. As a result of the probing of science, humankind can then manipulate the component parts and come up with a better design for life than what nature has provided.
5. For every action there is a reaction.
6. Human feelings need to be detached from every day decision so that the parameters of analytics can be maximized in objectively seeking to achieve the determined outcome.

Each of these six aspects of science and its application through technology influences the language program and inadvertently fosters the following parallel features:

1. Things could be better than they are leads to **JUDGMENT**.
2. When nature is viewed as a threat it leads one to look at means of **CONTROL**.
3. Science applies the principles of measurement, which requires **POLARIZATION**.
4. Technology, the application of science, requires **MANIPULATION**.
5. The principal of action/reaction fosters **FORCEFUL SEPARATION**.
6. The detachment of feelings leads to **INSENSITIVITY**.

The more dominant science and technology is within a culture the greater its influence and affect on the spoken language. When spoken it results without intent, in: **JUDGMENT, CONTROL, MANIPULATION, POLARIZATION, FORCEFUL SEPARATION AND INSENSITIVITY.**

The consequence of this unintentional and unrecognized affect is the weakening and at times the dissolving of healthy relationships.

Employing a language program in our personal relationships that is founded upon these principles of science results in:

1. One person judging another person as having room for improvement.
2. One person believing that they must be in control over the dynamics of their life.
3. One person seeking to understand others by analyzing them.
4. One person believing that they can help another person improve their life if only the other person would follow the advice given.
5. Believing that one's standards are appropriate for all people.
6. Believing that feelings are a sign of weakness.
7. Experiencing rejection and disrespect when people resist our help.

It is critical that people not use Technological English ignorant of its evolved design for solving problems of science and technology, and its potent side affect of undermining human relations. A new English language program needs to be developed specifically designed to allow the promotion of the sharing of feelings, which is the essential nature of human relationships.
