'Asbo' for 3 unruly peacock

A COUPLE have been hit with an Asbo warning after their peacocks were accused of running riot.

Farmers Becky Mullan-Feroze and Dave Markham have let Stephen, Esmerelda and Ariel roam free for years.

The birds often wander to a housing estate in Marehay, Derbys, where locals feed them.

But Amber Valley council has had a string of complaints about the birds making a din and pooping everywhere.

In a letter quoting the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, it warns the couple, both 55, to pen the birds or face a £2,500 fine.

Becky said: "I thought it was a joke at first. They're placid birds."

"It's bonkers — but we will respect the law."

The council confirmed it had sent a warning letter but declined to comment further.

Air yobs are jailed

FOUR stag party yobs have been jailed over some of the worst behaviour seen on an aircraft.

They guzzled vodka before fighting with each other and abusing crew.

Two of them tried to lift the skirts of stewardesses on the flight from Manchester to Las Vegas.

The four, from Oldham, were jailed for between 19 months and two years at Manchester crown court.

Judge Hilary Manley said: "An experienced crew said it was the worst behaviour she's seen in more than 20 years."

Hinch in ad probe

INSTAGRAM star Mrs Hinch is being investigated for plugging cleaning products in exchange for payment.

Social media influencer Sophie Hinchliffe, 29, gives cleaning advice to her 2.5million followers.

She is being probed by the advertising watchdog for promoting Flash and Febreze. It is thought she did not make it clear she was being paid by maker Procter & Gamble.

Last night, she said: "I feel my community are clear about any content."

A MANSION belonging to ex-JLS star Oritse Williams was ravaged by fire yesterday, days after he was cleared of raping a fan.

The property, previously owned by late comedian Ronnie Corbett, was bought by Oritse for £3million with his then-girlfriend in 2013.

The roof was destroyed in yesterday's blaze, with more than 70 firefighters taking nearly five hours to put out the inferno in Addington, South London.

Parts of the first and second floors of the three-storey home were also damaged.

Oritse, 32, put the six-bed property up for sale for £1.75million in January after he was charged with rape.

He allegedly allowed the house, Corbett's pride and joy for 33 years, to fall into disrepair and was no longer living at the property.

The garden swimming pool was half-full of green, stagnant water and surrounded by discarded furniture. Some windows were smashed and fence panels broken.

A London Fire Brigade spokesman said: "Ten fire engines and around 70 firefighters were called to a fire at a derelict property on Spout Hill in Croydon."

"Part of the first and second floor of a detached three-storey building were damaged by fire. Part of the roof was also damaged."

The cause is under investigation.

It comes days after the singer was cleared of raping a fan in a Wolverhampton hotel room in December 2016.

BOMB DOC FRENZY

AN Army doctor attacked his GP wife during a breakdown triggered by treating young victims of the Manchester bombing, a tribunal heard yesterday.

Major David Roscoe, 41, saw red in a trivial argument and was given a conditional discharge for common assault. He faces being struck off after being

given the 18-month conditional discharge. Roscoe, who has also treated Iraq War veterans, is now recovering back with his wife in Denton, Lincs.

He told the Manchester panel: "I was overwhelmed." The hearing continues.

£1M DRUG BRIT JAIL

A BRITISH grandad who smuggled drugs after falling for an email scam has been jailed for nine years.

Judges in Japan ruled it "impossible" that Frank Rodway, 67, did not know he had £1million of amphetamines.

The retired plasterer, of Salford, will be eligible for a UK jail transfer after

three years. Frank was arrested after flying to Tokyo from Mali, West Africa. He claimed he was given the bag by email scammers who duped him into chasing an £8million inheritance.

Daughter Laura, 45 said yesterday: "I can't believe it. I'm devastated and will do all I can to get him home."
