#### Extreme adventures a way of life for local student

Swimming through the silent, cold waters of Fremont Lake, David Rule felt at peace despite a vicious storm brewing in the sky above.

"It was really calming," he said. "You'd think it would be stressful or really invigorating, but the whole entire swim was really calm."

David, 19, a sophomore at UW, competed in the summer to break the 5 hour and 50 minute record to swim across the 9 miles of Fremont; a lake in Pinedale that averages a temperature in the mid-50s. He broke the record in 5 hours and 34 minutes.

Originally, six people were going to swim. David was the only one to finish. Due to the ever-present thunder and lightning storm, two people dropped out the morning of, David said. Several world-class Norwegian swimmers opted out the day before because of the chilling water temperatures.

David said he considered not swimming for a split-second, but decided to go for it anyway. The waters remained relatively calm. Rule said he was only challenged during the first and last mile.

"I went out way too fast," he said. "I was trying to get in the groove. I thought, 'Oh my gosh, I have nine of these.'"

A canoe followed David the entire swim. After three hours, David said he thought he had only been swimming for 30 minutes.

"Time went really fast — just cruising in the water," he said.

But his last mile the storm hit hard. David said the waves were huge, and it quickly became a battle to make any progress.

"I was fighting the waves and thinking, 'at any moment lightning could hit me,' he said.
