#### Jamie Towers Continues Quest to Go Green

In September 2016, General Manager Victor Berrios arranged for a meeting between the Jamie Towers Board of Directors and Solar Project Consultant Harshul Banthia of Sustainable Capital Advisors. As a result of this meeting, the board selected UGE as the designer/builder of a 1.5 megawatt solar panel installation at their property. Once completed, Jamie Towers will be home to the largest solar panel system of any residential property in New York City.

In October 2016, The NYPD Counterterrorism Bureau presented seminars during two different sessions for our associates on the topic of how to mitigate the risks from active shooter situations. It is important to understand that most active shooter situations are unpredictable and evolve quickly. Typically, the immediate deployment of law enforcement is required to stop the shooting and mitigate harm to victims. Because most incidents are over within minutes, it is crucial that we are prepared to deal with the situation until law enforcement personnel arrive.
