An auction took place on the night which alone raised over 66,300. Auctioneer and local artist John Fitzgerald ran the bidding and got people to dig deep for the items available.

The first was one of his own paintings, an original oil on canvas titled Scene from Carton Estate which sold for €550.

The highest selling items were a signed Irish rugby jersey from the team that defeated the All-Blacks (€1,500) and a private dining experience for eight people at the Avenue in Maynooth (€1,400).

There were also 19 raffle prizes up for grabs, including hotel stays, designer dresses, hampers and tech-gadgets, all donated from local businesses.

Earlier this week, the school principal, Mr Keogan paid tribute to the committee behind the Strictly Come Dancing event.

He said that because of their dedication, time and attention to detail the event will stand the test of time as "a truly historic event" in Kilcloon.

"There is no doubt that the heroes of the night were the brave dancers who gave every-thing in terms of commitment and even on occasions blood, sweat and tears but always qual-

ity," said Mr Keogan.
"Special teams produce special performances on big occasions and both the committee and dancers delivered when it mattered most.

"I would also like to acknowledge the absolute generosity of the whole school community and thank you so much for supporting the school is such an emphatic fashion," he added.
"From my view what stood out

like a beacon was the wonderful atmosphere and spirit that sur rounds the community of Kilcloon and it's a privilege to be part of this."
