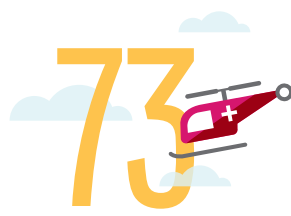


Colorado has more than 100 hospitals and health systems located in 45 counties around the state. These include general hospitals as well as pediatric, long-term acute care, behavioral health and rehabilitation facilities.



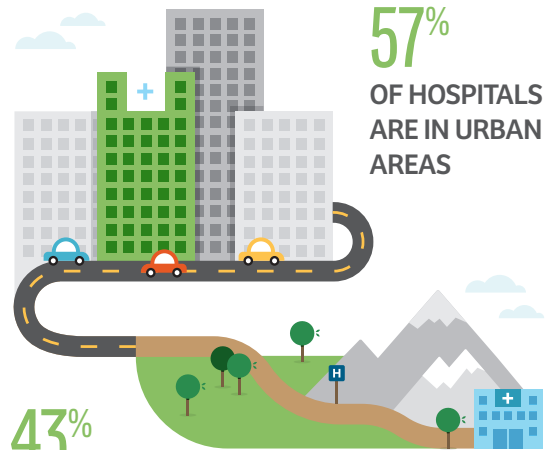
29 CRITICAL-ACCESS HOSPITALS

Colorado has 29 critical access hospitals which provide essential medical services to rural and remote areas of the state.



73 DESIGNATED TRAUMA CENTERS

There are 73 designated trauma centers in Colorado that provide expert care to patients with life-threatening and complex medical conditions 24/7.



43% OF HOSPITALS ARE IN RURAL AREAS

Rural hospitals are typically smaller and have fewer patients, but must still provide the same quality and a broad range of services to meet the needs of their communities.

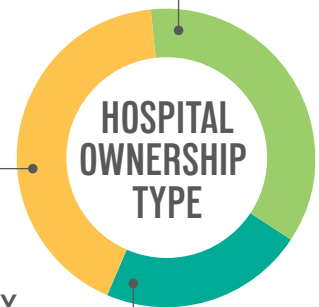

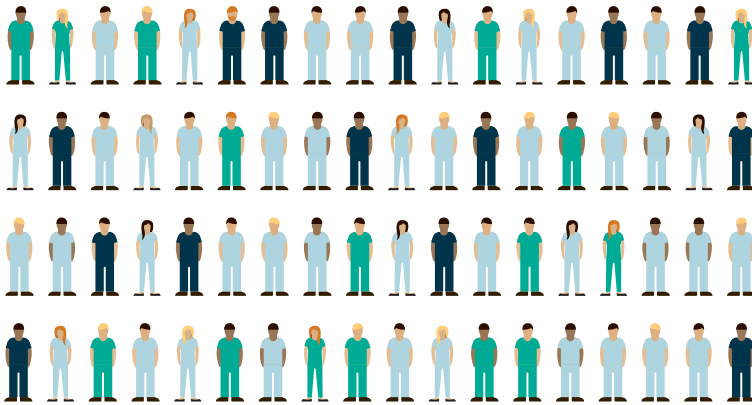

Ownership type varies widely in Colorado's hospitals. 42 percent are nonprofit, 36 percent are government-owned and 22 percent are privately owned facilities.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

72K EMPLOYING MORE THAN 72,000 WORKERS

Colorado hospitals employ **more than 72,000 workers**, representing more than \$4.45 billion in payroll and benefits. During the recent economic downturn, hospitals were one of the few sectors in Colorado that experienced job creation instead of job reductions.



\$19B CONTRIBUTED TO COLORADO'S ECONOMY

Colorado's hospitals contribute about \$19 billion to Colorado's economy each year, representing 4.2 percent of the state's economic output.*



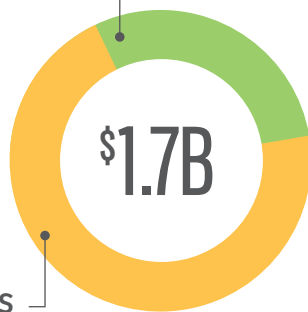
1:16 COLORADO JOBS ARE SUPPORTED BY HOSPITALS

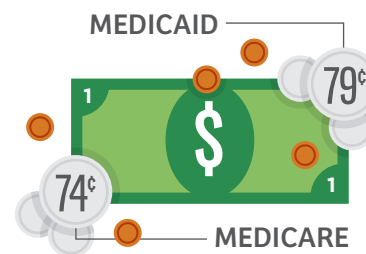

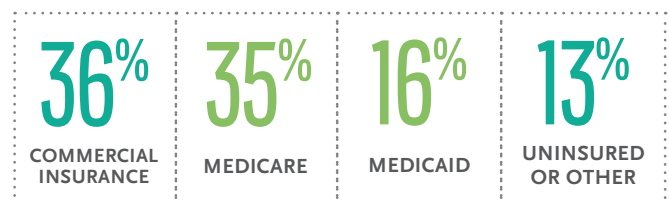
Colorado hospitals incurred more than **\$1.7 billion in uncompensated care and undercompensated care in 2012**. Of this amount, charity care and bad debt represented approximately \$500 million, while Medicare and Medicaid underpayments accounted for approximately \$1.2 billion.

HOSPITAL REIMBURSEMENT:



In 2012, Medicare paid only **74 cents** for each dollar hospitals spent caring for Medicare patients; and Medicaid paid only **79 cents** for each dollar hospitals spent caring for Medicaid patients.
