asa Bonay is a true Barcelona hotel, from the mosaic tiles to the black steel-framed windows overlooking the bustling Gran Via.

A 10-minute walk from the iconic El Born district (close enough, but with distance from the tourist crowd), the hotel is a collaborative project.

"We wanted to make sure Casa Bonay felt of Barcelona, rooted in and specific to the city," New Yorkbased designers Studio Tack say.

"We also wanted it to be inviting for all - whether a guest at the hotel, a local patron or a visitor."

Among the bones of the historic 19th-century single-family mansion (the Bonay family), the designers first noticed the beautiful mosaic floors in each of the rooms.

"It was important that this was salvaged to tell a bit of the building's history," they say. The floor also defined the entrance, where Studio Tack repurposed Barcelona's ornate public footpath, to encourage passers-by to come in and explore.

The lobby also poses intrigue through huge green foliage by landscape gardener Alejandra Coll, who helped the hotel earn its nickname, Bonay Jungle. Coll's work is also seen on the hotel's rooftop, where her herb and decorative garden surround the barbecue bar, Chiringuito, and private guest lounging space.
