Programmers might find RoboRally particularly interesting. In this game, you each have one robot that has to cross a treacherous factory floor while accomplishing goals in the right order and dodging other players' robots. Be warned, this game takes strategy, route-planning, and quick decision-making skills to reach the finish line!

5. Burp

Taking it down a notch from all our other fast-paced board games, Burp is rather light and easy to understand – but still challenging to pull off. You need to build a pier from which you can start fishing using a limited number of planks and small rocks . Build an unsound dock and it will collapse, big a large dock, and your fishing haul would be larger. And if you lose some of the pieces, you can always pick up rocks from your yard.

Of course, there are a whole lot of other board games that you can try, depending on your interests. You might want to look at *Strain, Power Grid, Leonardo Da Vinci*, or even *Cards Against Humanity*. I do suggest that you take particular interest in playing *Diplomacy* – though it might not be an engineering-specific game, it provides insight into the workings of an office, and might just make your work relationships much better.
