On a crisp and cool morning in July, the stately *Silver Muse* sidled up to Hubbard Glacier—a sleeping giant measuring more than six miles wide where it meets the ocean. Because it was a clear and sunny day, the captain was able to position the ship closely to the glacier, allowing the Inspirato members on board to take in truly once-in-a-lifetime views.

As the glacier calved in the soft morning sun, the sound was otherworldly; a thunderous cracking could be heard from the observation deck as large blocks of ice would plunge into the glassy waters of Disenchantment Bay. To boot, there was an abundance of wildlife in the bay; hundreds of harbor seals popped their heads above water, a bald eagle perched on an iceberg nearby, and two moose were spotted swimming near the glacier, dodging icebergs along their way. Onboard naturalist Natalie Bruce narrated the experience over the intercom, remarking that seeing this much action at the glacier was quite rare and special—Alaska was indeed showing off.

As Inspirato member Cy Alizadeh witnessed all of this unfold at the ship's observation deck, he remembers thinking, "Wow, *this* is Alaska."

In fact, you can even enjoy a morning latte and extravagant breakfast made to order from your own balcony, brought to you by your dedicated butler. With each room receiving personalized butler service around the clock, the sky's the limit to the kind of pampering experience you can have.

"Sometimes people are hesitant to ask their butler for things, but it's more than okay to say, 'Please bring me a cocktail at 5 p.m. while I'm putting on my makeup and dressing for the evening.' And it's okay to ask your butler to pack and unpack for you, or to shine your shoes," said Cecilia Blevins, Silversea senior charter sales director, who joined Inspirato on their 2019 voyage.

"Our butlers are great at anticipating the guests' needs and putting personal touches in rooms based on what they've asked for before. They really get to know they guests," she said.

Another reason Inspirato chose Silversea to charter an Alaskan voyage for its members is the spaciousness that the *Silver Muse* provides, making it easy and enjoyable to get around the ship—something everyone can appreciate, especially those with limited mobility, or those traveling with children

We also loved making connections with other Inspirato members on the cruise and how cruising allows you to be social and interact with others as much or as little as you want to," the Ruscettas said.

For many people on board, like Inspirato member David Loven, the highlight was witnessing the unique beauty the state has to offer and having quiet moments where the scenery seemed to stop time.

"One day I was off the back of the boat smoking a cigar and having a scotch and there was a double rainbow on full display, then as if someone cued it up, a whale started jumping in the water nearby. It was so quiet and almost eerie—the sound of the water, the rainbow, the captivating landscape on all sides of me. You kind of have to pinch yourself, because the landscape is so surreal—it's hard to describe the vastness and beauty," recounted Loven.
