G Bold, fearless and powerful" is how designer Latina and photographer Vanessa Acosta describes the Paragon Desert girl; the moniker of her Etsy shop filled with vintage finds and one-of-a-kind designs made by Acosta using hand woven textiles from South America, Asia and beyond. "She's the type who doesn't question whether she can 'work' that outfit, she just does." Born in Virginia and raised in California, Acosta, who spent a portion of her childhood in Bolivia, sources textiles from her parent's homeland, and scours small town Goodwill stores to procure vintage gems for Paragon Desert. She counts a sequined jacket with tulips sprouting from the hem as one of her best finds to date. "I have a crazy obsession with sequins, so my vintage pieces are my treasures."

With a background in Fashion Design (she studied at the Fashion Institute of Design & Merchandising, Los Angeles), Acosta says running her own business is a dream come true. "I'm a do-it-yourself kind of gal – sourcing fabric, puzzling the pieces together, adjusting the fit – it's what I love to do." A long-standing meditation process of sorts, Acosta listens only to clas-

making or sewing. In addition to running Paragon Desert, Acosta is a keen photographer. "I briefly dated a photographer and saw how different a man's lens view was when it came to shooting women. That's why I only offer my services to women/trans women. It's an empowering experience to sit, chat, and understand one other - the successes, the struggles - and then just shoot."
