SAFE & SOUND

We spoke to a number of people and compiled a list of travel destinations that are safe and a number that should be avoided when you're thinking of jet setting

VISIT: Greek Islands, Ibiza, Spain, Singapore, London, France, Austria, Ladakh, New Zealand, Canada and South Africa (except Johannesburg) **AVOID:** Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Syria, China, Iran, Iraq, Afghanistan and Somalia

TRAVEL TIPS

All the women we spoke to felt there were a number of things women should keep in mind before venturing out in the big bad world alone. We compiled a list of their suggestions to give you a quick guide of things to remember:

- Know your destination before you start your journey. Note down information about the embassy and find out about the culture and appropriate dress code.
- Leave a copy of your itinerary back home.
- Never travel without documents and insurance and keep your passport close at hand.

 • Avoid wearing anything flashy
- that may attract attention
- Stay off the streets in remote areas too late at night. It's good to have company if you are outdoors. Even when you're in a "safe" place don't let your guard down and use common sense when you are out to sightsee, shop or eat a meal
- Never compromise on fun but try to not get drunk or mingle with people unless you've spoken to them for sometime to judge their intentions. Remember never to leave your drinks unattended.

Nways look confide

I have cycled from Pune to Goa by myself and also traveled alone for a cycle tour in France. Planning your trip before is limited when you're talking about cycling and when I started 20 years ago, there was no Google Maps to help out and I had very unreliable maps! But, the experience is worth it. I always made sure I found a place to stay before lunchtime and never stayed out alone after it got too dark. If you're in a place off the chart it's tougher than tourist filled destinations so it's a good idea to establish friendly contact with some of the locals .- Divya Tate, Cyclist



'I love travelling! I make it a point to visit at least one new place every year. I have met so many interesting people, some of whom I am still in touch with. I have also been to places that were not on my original itinerary! You also have the ease of planning as hectic or relaxed a schedule as you like and sometimes making impromptu plans with the new people that you meet. I've tried Couchsurfing (a traveler's website); it added a new dimension to solo travel because there are very warm, hospitable people who will host you and make you understand and appreciate their culture in a way that even guidebooks cannot do justice to. I've done a fair amount of solo travel over the years. My first trip abroad had a solo leg when I went to Scotland on my own. I have also traveled alone to Ladakh, to Spain and France, and most recently to Cambodia, a few months ago. Especially for a woman, it's important to read up beforehand about what each place is like. On your trip, be open to meeting new people but always be aware of your surroundings and ensure you don't ignore your inbuilt safety meter. Apart from that, just go out there and enjoy yourself without worrying constantly!"

You have to be careful even in a safe place

"Every party destination around the world has a dark side to it. Even in a safe place there are secluded lanes and train stations that women should avoid. For example, London has a great night scene and boasts of night club hubs. These places are usually crowded and there is good police vigilance through the night, but the city also has parts that you should not visit alone too late. For anyone, not just women, who party or travel alone, it's advisable to share their travel dates, flights and accommodation with someone. It's always good to carry a local SIM card and have emergency contact information. There are lots of self defense products available such as pepper spray, ultra sonic alarms, GPS trackers and more.'

believe that at the end of the day it all comes down to how much time and effort you have put into research, plus some common sense. I have met a lot of single women travelers and most seem to know precisely what they are doing. When you think of 'party places,' it is best to be responsible for your own safety rather than depend on a book. Most people are always looking to help in their local cities but you have to develop a knack of sticking to certain rules. The key is you that you must know or find out about the places you are going to visit if you plan on having a good, hassle free time on your vacation."
