The Chanler - Newport, RI

It's no surprise that The Chanler at the Cliff Walk is consistently ranked as one of the United States' top hotels. It is the epitome of refined elegance, a chateaux on the edge of the world. Falling in line with Newport's turn-of-the-19th-century opulence, The Chanler luxuriously reimagines and delivers the Old World to the modern guest. Here, you can enjoy a glass of wine or a seafood dish on the veranda; or lounge in your suite, with endless views of sky, sea and scenes reminiscent of the Gilded Age.

Just past the resort is the Cliff Walk, a three and a half mile path stretching along the Atlantic Ocean shoreline. Along the way you'll pass a few of the extraordinary Newport Mansions, including the Breakers, the largest of the summer homes. Stroll hand in hand through these lavish homes and gardens, turning time back with each step. And while in the 'City by the Sea,' make sure to stroll along the beach or try your hand at boating.

Twin Farms - Barnard, VT

Author Sinclair Lewis purchased the Twin Farms property in 1928 for his new wife, Dorothy Thompson. Though it has since fallen into a number of owners' hands, Twin Farms retains the same romance and allure that it gave to its first, madly in love couple. Near the inn is Copper Pond, where you may find yourself for an afternoon swim or a canoe ride at dusk. Soak in the open air and sprawling lands to satisfy your inner peace.

Twin Farms is a community in and of itself. Days can be consumed with bicycling and hiking on the surrounding trails or rallying on the property's tennis and croquet courts. Unwind at the spa or in a Japanese Ofuro; a heated, freshwater soaking tub. The property also includes a pub decorated in local color and, outside, a fire pit for midnight s'mores and stargazing. Other entertainment can be found in the puzzles, games, and library. You wouldn't have to leave the confines of the land to find something to do: it all feels new, intriguing and worthy of your time.

If you are looking for activity away from Twin Farms, the Woodstock Market Green is your one-stop wonder for a collection of trinkets and furniture. Vermont is at its finest in the fall, and places like Sugarbush Farm and the Marsh-Billings Rockefeller National Historic Park are sights to see.







Captain Lord Mansion - Kennebunkport, ME
