ORIGINAL WRITING:

So, to Muslims the Adam's footprint is the symbolized story of God's eternal love to humans and Ceylon is the meeting place. Nīshābūrī explicated the detailed accounts of the difficulties of pilgrimage of the Adam's footprint ranging from getting passport from its governor to enter to this territory until the cumbrous path of pilgrimage (9-13). Finally, it should be identified that until 1972 Sri Lanka was known as Ceylon (Peebles, 2006: 1).

AFTER KAY'S EDITING:

To Muslims, Adam's footprint is the symbolized story of God's eternal love for humans, and Ceylon was the meeting place for the manifestation of that love. The pilgrimage to Adam's footprint is difficult, requiring a passport from the governor for entry into that territory and an arduous, physically demanding journey for reaching the final destination. Nīshābūrī explicated various accounts of these difficulties in great detail (9-13). Finally, it should be noted that until 1972, Sri Lanka was known as Ceylon (Peebles, 2006: 1).

ORIGINAL WRITING:

As consequence of the peerless strategically situation, the Indian Ocean as major provider of sea route connecting the Middle East, Africa, and East Asia with Europe played chief role to enable people and ideas to cross the Indian Ocean, more precisely establishing the relationship between maritime trades and accelerating the process of cultural diffusion and interaction.

AFTER KAY'S EDITING:

The Indian Ocean played a peerlessly strategic role connecting Europe with the Middle East, Africa, and East Asia, which enabled the exchange of ideas from these cultures by giving people an efficient way to cross.. It also established a relationship between maritime trades and the acceleration of cultural diffusion (both its processes and its interactions).
