

REGENT IS SECURE

- Each participating practice retains ownership of its practice data and the AAO-HNSF retains ownership of the aggregate data in RegentSM.
- All identifiable patient information is stored on a secure, HIPAA-compliant cloud-based server.
- All Regent participants are assigned unique login credentials to allow access to Regent through a secure website.
- All data extraction and upload activity is fully encrypted.

REGENT TECHNOLOGY MAKES PARTICIPATION SIMPLE

Regent uses a Registry Practice Connector (RPC) to access, query, and transfer data from your EHR to the servers supporting Regent with little to no impact on physician workflow. The RPC allows Regent flexibility in mapping data elements required by the registry with minimal effort on the part of the practice.

MEMBERSHIP

Every physician must be a member of the AAO-HNS in order to participate in Regent. Non-physician providers including nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, audiologists, and speech pathologists do not need to become members of the AAO-HNS to participate in Regent.

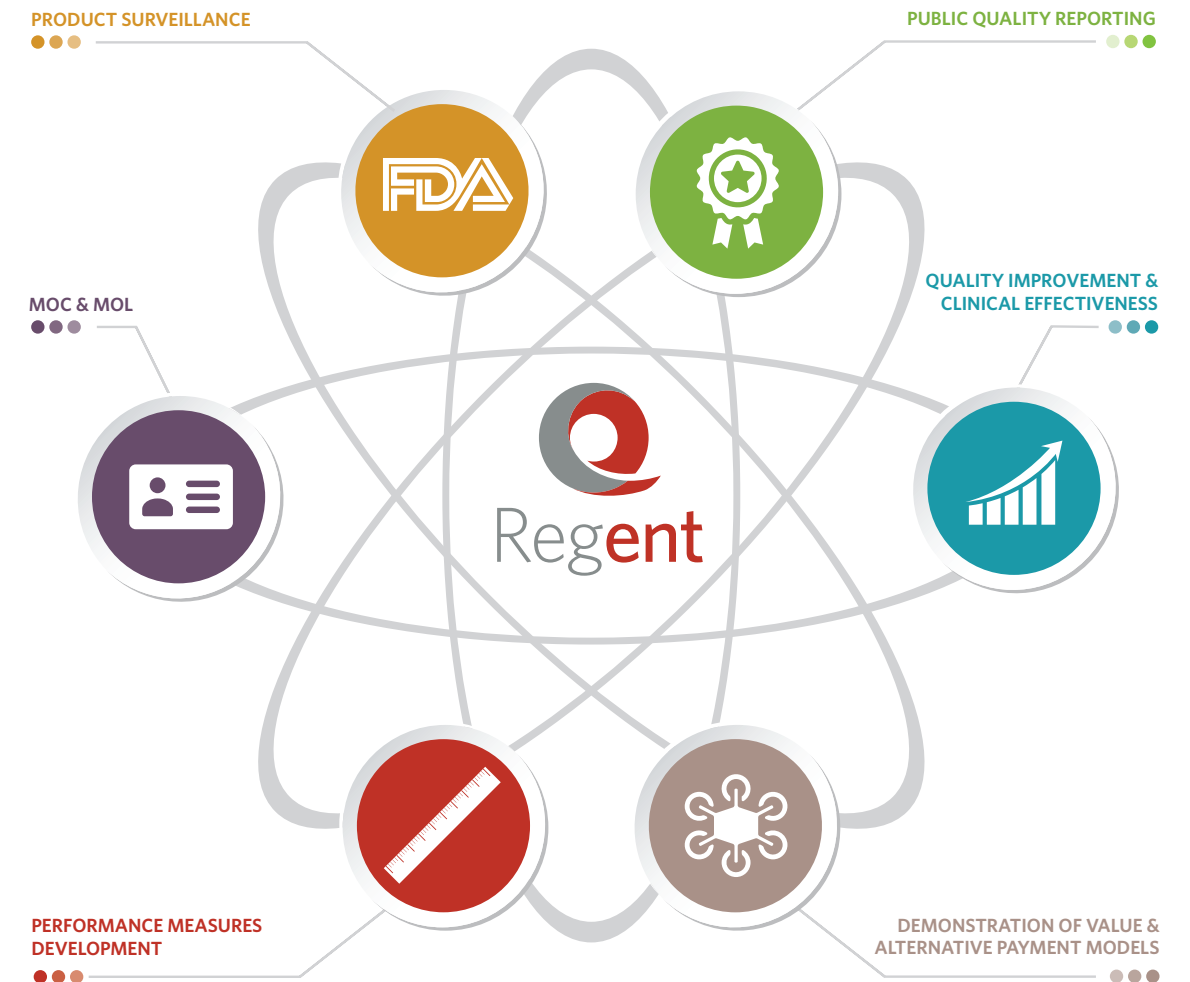

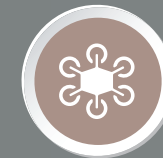
PUBLIC QUALITY REPORTING

Regent will help you report on quality measures for federal and private programs. The Qualified Clinical Data Registry (QCDR) designation provides the ability to satisfy requirements for the Physician Quality Reporting System (PQRS) and future Merit-Based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) participation.



QUALITY IMPROVEMENT AND CLINICAL EFFECTIVENESS

Regent will utilize longitudinal data to identify gaps in performance and gaps in care provided both at the individual practitioner and system levels.



DEMONSTRATION OF VALUE AND ALTERNATIVE PAYMENT MODELS
