- 1. Kihei Kihei is located on the southwest shore of Maui, the sunniest part of the island. It features six miles of beaches, so you're sure to find an ideal spot on the sand. The sunset is nothing short of spectacular; enjoy it from the beach or a sunset cruise. The lively town boasts plenty of restaurants and bars, and offers a variety of activities. From your base in town, explore some of the other extraordinary beaches on the southwest coast, including Wailea Beach, and Makena Beach, or the so-called Big Beach, which are consistently rated as some of the best in the country.
- 2. **Lahaina** Lahaina is a historic whaling village that evolved into a Maui hotspot. It was once frequented by sailors, including Herman Melville, author of "Moby Dick." Nowadays you can still get a feel for the old village as you stroll the streets. In the town's center you'll find a massive banyan tree; take some time to relax in the shade of its branches and watch life go by. Lahaina is also a great place to get a taste of local cuisine and visit a seaside luau, a typical Hawaiian evening that includes great food and traditional hula dance.
- 3. **Hana** Hana is tucked away in the eastern part of the island. Getting there requires a scenic drive down the legendary Hana Highway, which has many twists, turns, and narrow bridges, but rewards you with breathtaking landscapes and stunning views. Hana is a peaceful small town and the kind of place where time doesn't seem to exist—this is where you'll get the real aloha feeling. Just outside town, you can visit the Pools of Oheo for a swim in tranquil waters, and access Haleakala National Park.

What to Do During Your Honeymoon in Maui

Nobody will blame you if you decide to just relax on one of Hawaii's incredible beaches. But if you feel like getting a bit more active, consider the following activities.

1. **Watch the sunrise at Haleakala National Park** Haleakala means House of the Sun in Hawaiian, and the sunrise here might be the most beautiful one you'll ever see, with its abundance of colors painting the sky. Wake up early, pack a blanket to keep warm, and watch this miracle of nature unfold. On a side note, the sunset and starry night sky are

- also spectacular. Besides this, there are many hiking trails in the park, and you can even choose to camp here.
- 2. Go diving or snorkeling at Molokini Molokini is a partially submerged volcanic crater forming a small uninhabited island off the coast of Maui. Inside the arms of the crater lies a marine sanctuary with incredible underwater life. The crystal clear water is a wonderland of colorful corals and tropical fish. Due to the extraordinary visibility and great marine diversity this a world-class diving and snorkeling destination. There's a suitable spot for everybody, from first-time snorkelers to experienced divers.
- 3. **Take a surfing or stand-up paddle boarding lesson** Hawaii is where surfing was born, and the sport is firmly rooted in the local culture. Maybe you're satisfied with just watching the pros do their thing, but if you're feeling adventurous, you might give it a try yourself and take a lesson. Alternatively, go for stand-up paddle boarding, a variation on surfing that's easier to learn. Once you have the basics down, you can explore the coastline by stand-up paddle board, a fun and unique experience.

What to Pack for Your Honeymoon in Maui
