They're an agent of mystery and a barrier from the outside world. Veils also master elegance and the art of subtle statements.

Why Veils Should Make a Comeback.

Mystery

Barrier

Mastering Elegance

Sculptors have captured and mastered elegance by smoothing and softening the hardest of materials, but what might be one of the most exceptional techniques is known as wet drapery. This allows the artist to show the contours and the shape of a subject despite them being fully covered, mimicking the way a veil would cover a face or drapery would cover a body. Just like these sculptures, the thin forming fabric of a veil creates a delicate finish to your outfit –lacquering your features in an elegant varnish.

A Subtle Statement

At one time in history many people wore veils, so wearing a veil would not have been anything out of the ordinary. However today veils are not common. If you saw someone in a veil, our guess is you'd notice them, and you'd probably want to know who it is. The veil, often historically worn for concealment has taken a new role in the fashion world, consistently maintaining its delicate aesthetic but now as a statement piece.
