GRACE SOFTBALL COMES UP SHORT AGAINST INDIANA WESLEYAN

WINONA LAKE, Ind. – The Lady Lancers were unable to stifle the offense of the Indiana Wesleyan Wildcats, losing 11-3 and 7-5 at the Miller Athletic Complex on Friday, April 14.

The Lady Lancers (4-14 in the Crossroads League) were outdone by three home runs in the first game and losing early by run rule. However, Grace struck first thanks to an RBI single from Chandler Elliott's to score Sam Heim. But the Wildcats exploded offensively, scoring 11 runs over the next four innings. The only runs that Grace could score in the opener were in the third inning thanks to a two-out, two RBI double from Kyleigh Garner.

IWU was able to strand the bases loaded and cling to a two-run lead with a called third strike to end the rally and to conclude the series.
