As the daughter of a former Formula 1 team boss, the fashion designer Zoë Jordan spent much of her life on the move —until she found a sense of calm in Mallorca

peripatetic upbringing has meant that relocation doesn't daunt Zoë Jordan in the slightest. The daughter of motor racing figurehead Eddie Jordan, the fashion designer has lived in London, New York, Hong Kong and, since September last year, Mallorca. "We were just ready for another adventure," she explains. Mother to three girls, Eden, 5, Dylan, 4, and Inez, 1, Jordan, 37, and her husband, Steve Aspinall, were married eight years ago in Deia, on the northern ridge of the island, and settled in Calvia, in the southwest.

Their home is sleek, modern and open-plan, but designed using locally sourced stone and


